ENGAGING SPIRITUAL BATTLE

SOME IMPORTANT "SCHEMES" OF THE ENEMY Session 1

- I. Key verses:
 - A. Ephesians 6:10: "Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes."
 - B. Corinthians 2:5-11 (with focus on verse 11): "...in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes."
- II. Some Common "Schemes" of the Enemy.

A. Deception.

- 1. It grows out of the Enemy's very nature (John 8:44; Revelation 12:9; 2 Corinthians 11:13-15).
- 2. It supports the Enemy's other "schemes."
- 3. In personal healing ministry we run into two basic types of deception:
 - a. Cognitive deception
 - b. Affective deception
- 4. The Goal of Deception:
 - a. Serves as a basis for other "schemes."
 - b. To create a Barrier between Us and the Lord.
 - c. To Create a barrier between us and the Body of Christ.
 - d. To create a chasm between our mind and our heart.
 - e. Death and destruction.
- 5. The "antidote" to cognitive deception.
 - a. Confess to the Lord that we have believed a lie.
 - b. Reject the lie verbally in prayer.
 - c. Embrace the truth.

B. Temptation.

- 1. Key verses:
 - a. Matthew 6:13
 - b. 1 Corinthians 10:11-13
 - c. James 1:13-15
- 2. The goal of temptation
 - a. To undermine our relationship with the Lord.
 - b. To create patterns of sin and accusation.
 - c. To destroy lives, families and ministries.
- 3. Resisting temptation
 - a. Look for the "way out" and take it!
 - b. Seek support from a Christian you can trust.
 - c. If the temptation continues, ask the Lord, "Lord, why is this temptation so strong?"

C. Accusation

- 1. Key verse: Revelation 12:10
- 2. Key observations:
 - a. Accusation is often based on deception.
 - b. Accusation is often paired with temptation.
 - c. Accusation often leads to discouragement and despair.
- D. Discouragement and Despair.
 - 1. Key Verses: 2 Corinthians 2:5-11 and John 21:15-19
 - 2. The Role of Deception in Discouragement and Despair
 - 3. Key responses:
 - a. Don't let yourself move into isolation.
 - b. Search the Scriptures.
 - c. Take your struggle to the Lord.

GETTING PRACTICAL ABOUT SPIRITUAL WARFARE Session 2

How do we recognize the enemy's schemes? What are some of his most common ploys?

- I. Deception
 - A. Cognitive we know we believe something that isn't true.
 - B. Affective we have a feeling about statements that are true.
- II. If recognizing the lie, confessing it and affirming the truth doesn't seem to solve the problem what do we do?
 - A. Recognize that we have a deeply rooted deception that only God can address.
 - B. Ask the Lord to give insight into where the lie began and why.
 - C. Respond to what the Lord has shown you.
 - 1. Ask the Lord to bring you truth.
 - a. Do you need to forgive someone who hurt you or taught you this lie?
 - b. Do you need to confess that you have accepted the lie as truth?
 - c. Reject the lie and embrace the truth ask God to plant it deeply in your heart.
 - d. Take authority over the enemy he has no right to continue to condemn or to push you toward sin in this area.
- III. Questioning God and anger with God.
 - A. It started in the garden! Genesis 3
 - B. It stems from deception.
 - C. We often deny the fact that we are angry with God because it isn't what good Christians believe.
 - D. Ask the Lord to show you what you believe about him that isn't true.
 - E. Ask the Lord to show you the truth and then respond to it.
 - F. Take authority over the enemy he has no right to continue to condemn or to push you toward sin in this area.
- IV. Loneliness and Isolation
 - A. This also started in the garden.

- B. Rejection and fear of rejection.
- C. Shame and guilt.
- D. Comparison Instagram and Facebook.
- E. Deception—no one wants me, if they knew my secret sin they would be disgusted, I have nothing to offer, etc.
- F. Ask the Lord to show you the truth and respond to it.
- G. Take authority over the enemy.
- V. Pornography
 - A. The roots of pornography are in feelings of loneliness and isolation.
 - B. Pornography and masturbation are often used to self-comfort or soothe.
 - C. This is a difficult pattern to break—it will need deep level work as well as accountability.
 - D. Ask the Lord to revel the roots of this pattern.
 - E. Respond to what the Lord has shown you.
 - F. Take authority over the enemy!
- VI. One of the most effective ways to defeat the enemy's schemes is to know who we are in Christ and to stand firm in that truth.
 - A. Ephesians 1-3
 - B. Psalm 23
 - C. Psalm 103
 - D. Meditate on scripture such as these.
 - 1. Ask the Spirit to show you what prevents you from believing what is true.
 - 2. Respond to what the Spirit has shown you.
